

Campbell Hall Community Diversity At-A-Glance

- K-12th grade students of color: 32.7%
- 1 in 4 students receive need-based financial aid
- Campbell Hall is very proud of the wide variety of colleges where our students enroll. Historically 99% of Campbell Hall graduates attend a 4-year institution immediately after graduating. - Faculty:
 - K-12th faculty of color: 18.0%
 - K-12th faculty that hold a masters or doctorate degree: 53.3%
 - K-12th full-time faculty teaching experience:
 - Average # of years of teaching experience: 16 years
 - 1-5 years teaching experience: 13.5%
 - 6-10 years teaching experience: 24%
 - 11-15 years teaching experience: 23.1%
 - 16-20 years teaching experience: 14.4%
 - More than 20 years teaching experience: 25%
 - 110 Faculty
 - An additional 25 people teach at least one class (administrators, tech, librarian, health staff)

- In addition to carrying a challenging academic course load, students participate in a variety of extracurricular opportunities, including: athletics, visual arts, dance, music, student publications, student-led clubs, affinity groups, and student government leadership positions.
- Feeder school diversity (for grades 1-12th): students admitted to Campbell Hall in 2010 came from 14 different public schools and 52 different independent/private schools.
